

A unique opportunity to observe four hair transplantation surgeries will be offered to a limited number of registrants who quickly enroll for this session. This will be a course directed at advanced surgeons in the field. Enrollment will only be taken on a first come, first served basis. Dr. Markman will perform a micro and minigraft combination hair transplant. Dr. Dominic A. Brandy will perform a Bilateral Occipitoparietal Scalp Lift. A live laser assisted hair transplant utilizing a super pulsed CO_a laser, will be performed by Dr. Dow B. Stough. The fourth operation will be a 1500-2000 graft megasession hair transplant performed by Dr. Ron Shapiro. Participants will rotate among the four surgeries being able to observe and ask questions during the procedures. When not in rotation, participants will remain in an auditorium where each surgery will be transmitted to one of four closed circuit television monitors to view. This event is only opened to experienced surgeons in the field.

However, with the introduction of scalp stretching technology, a dramatic reinterest in the technique has evolved. 


