President's Message



Barcelona, Spain

Barcelona is a northern city in the south. It is European, industrial and commercial, bourgeois and modern. At the same time it is also Mediterranean, popular, traditional and has a mild climate. Barcelona is famous for its museums, art galleries, operas, concerts, night life and restaurants. With its hospitality and history, coupled with its dynamism and enterprising character, the city has propelled toward the future. Host to the 1992 Olympics, the city undertook a general renewal of its architecture, built new districts and still today, Barcelona continues this philosophy of growth. Barcelona also boasts The Picasso Museum collection which includes over 2,000 works donated by the artist and housed in a converted palace and the Museum of Catalan Art, with its superb collection of Romanesque paintings and frescoes. There are literally hundreds of fine restaurant choices and special to Barcelona are bars called "champanerias" that feature Catalan "cavas", wines of the Champagne Method. Barcelona is outdoor flower markets, yachts anchored in the Mediterranean, stylish restaurants and night clubs serving the food of Catalonia and soulful Spanish music and dance.

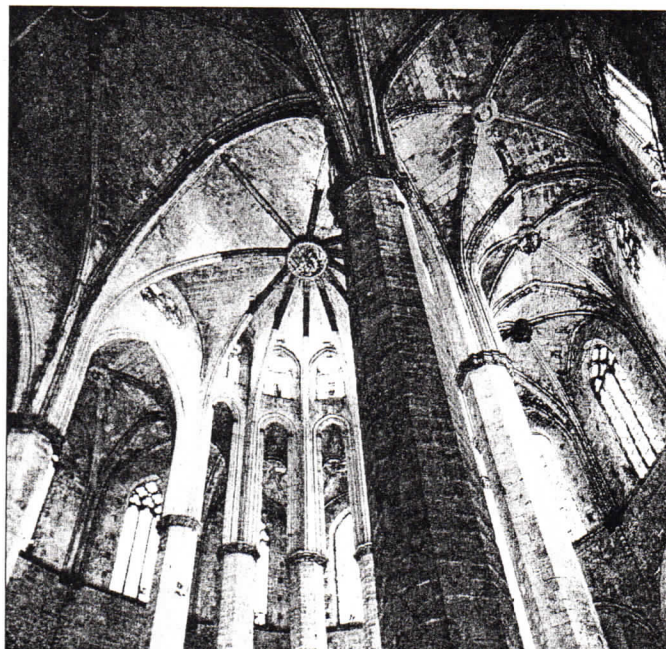

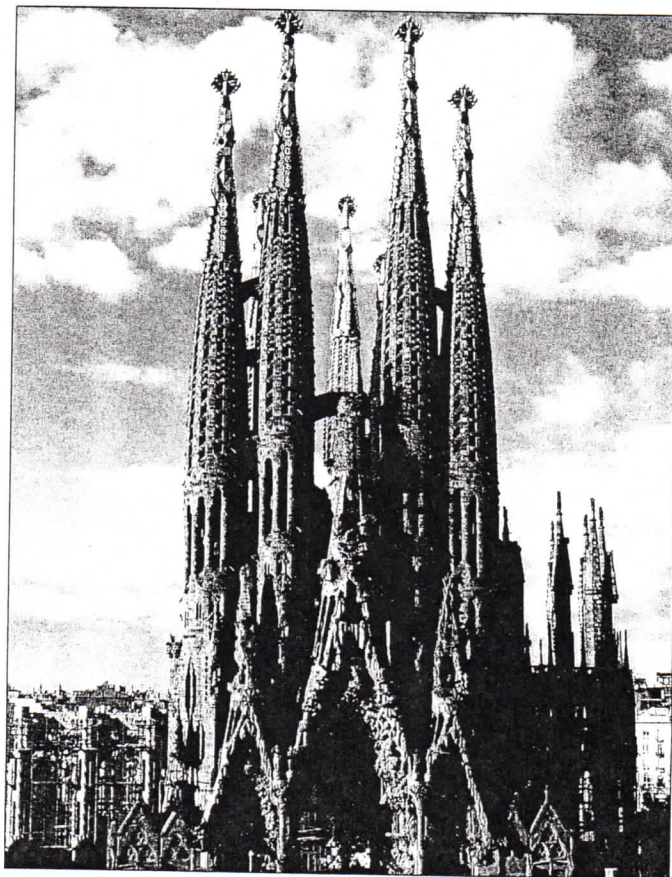

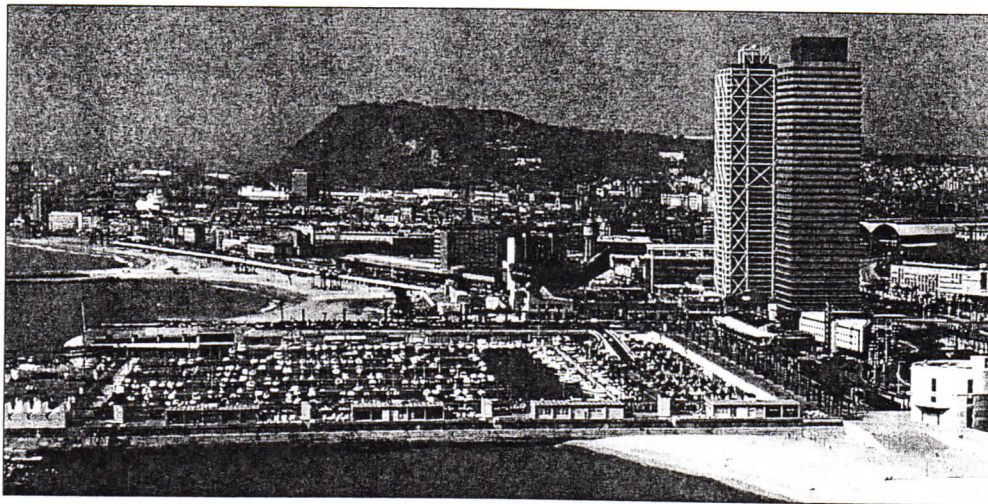

The first stop on this tour is the Cathedral located in Barcelona's historic Gothic Quarter. Highlights of the Cathedral are the crypt of Santa Eulalia, the beautifully carved choir stalls, the 15th century chapel of Santo Cristo which houses the crucifix carried into the Battle of Lepanto against the Ottomans, and the tall cloisters surrounding a tropical garden. The tour will then continue to Barcelona's most emblematic landmark, Antoni Gaudi's Temple Expiatori de la Sagrada Familia. This unique, striking and surreal cathedral is still only about 40% finished. Work is currently in progress on the nave. There are elevators that go to the top of the east towers for a spectacular bird's eye view of the cathedral and the city. The tour will then continue past another Gaudi building, Casa Mila, nicknamed La Pedrera (The Quarry). Its curving stone facade and ornamental balconies make it one of the best examples of modernist architecture. You will also view the Casa Battlo by Gaudi. The final stop will be the Picasso Museum, a 15th century medieval palace which houses much of Picasso's early works.

Montserrat Tour (Event #603)

Montserrat is Catalonia's most important religious retreat and is located in the mountains outside of Barcelona. A monastery has stood on this site since the Medieval Ages, though the current monastery was re-built in the 19th century. The basilica contains works of arts by various artists, including El Greco. (Please note: Lunch is not included in this tour)

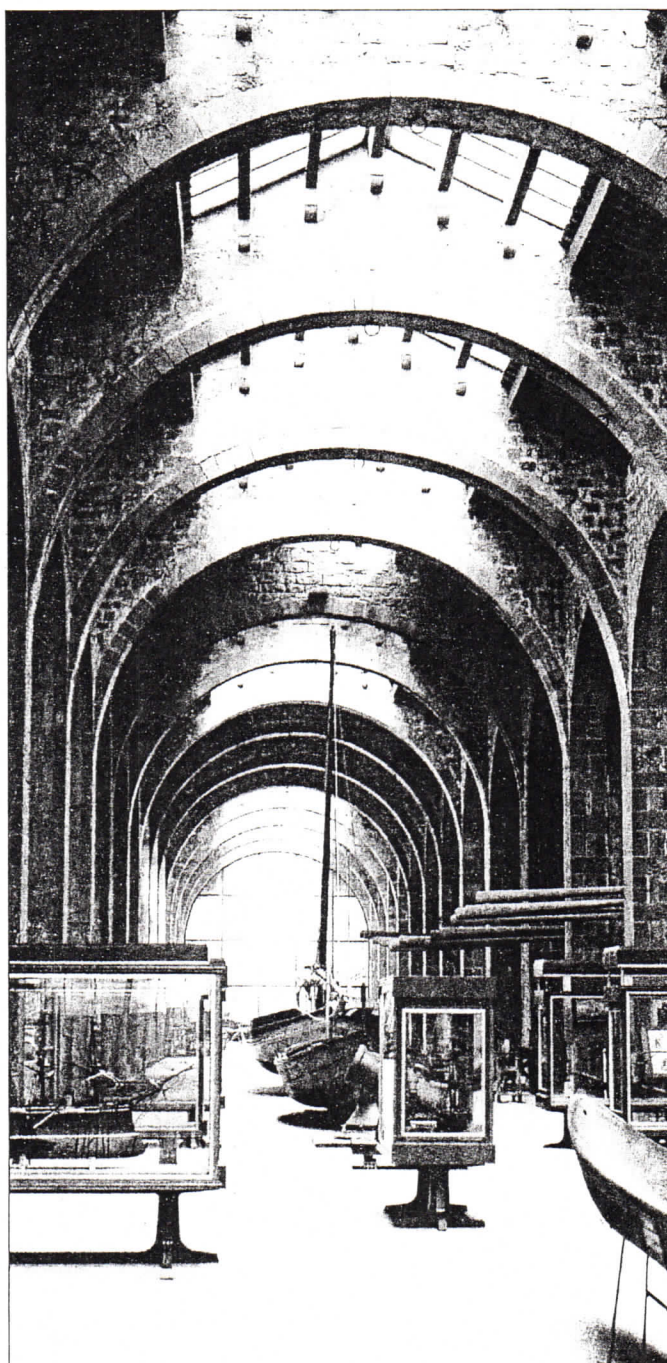
Wine Cellar and Sitges Tour (Event #604)
