

BEGINNER'S PROGRAM

Organized by: John P. Cole, MD & William M. Parsley, MD

The beginners program is designed to provide basic knowledge of hair restoration surgery. The participant may possess minimal or seasoned experience in the field of hair restoration. This program begins with a general overview of hair restoration surgery and a historical reflection. We will cover the diagnosis, consultation, donor harvest, graft preparation, hairline design, and graft placement. In addition, we will cover an introduction to scalp reduction surgery on the beginner level. Since a large portion of any medical practice requires business and marketing acumen, we will cover this area, as well. With the advent of large sessions of follicular unit grafting, staffing has taken added importance. Therefore, staff management and training will be discussed.

The faculty of this program has years of clinical and educational experience in the field of hair restoration surgery. Many devote their entire medical practice to this field. You will find them brimming with detailed understanding and remarkably approachable.

Included in the beginner's course is a detailed manual devoted to your education. Several authors have prepared abstracts directed at the beginner's level. In addition, we have several training videos designed to help you with graft placement, donor harvesting, hairline design, and recipient site preparation.

Following the didactic session, you will have an opportunity to implement your new knowledge at the hands-on workshop. Here you will be able to ask questions and gain insight from a host of experienced hair restoration surgeons. There will be nine stations in which participants will formally rotate. Most stations are directly hands-on and others are for observation only. For the novice, as well as, the experienced surgeon, the entire experience should prove meaningful, thought provoking, and insightful.

101: Basic science and medical treatments: What's hot in the world of hair research

Research into the basic workings of the hair follicle continues at a feverish pace. Several important studies have been published recently which not only further our understanding of hair follicle physiology but also suggest new options for treating hair loss. In this workshop, basic hair physiology is briefly reviewed with emphasis placed on recent research findings. New hair growth treatments including cell stimulants, enzyme and receptor blockers, gene therapy, and tissue engineering are also discussed. Finally, the use of 'pseudo-science' in various quack treatments is briefly discussed.

102: Automation in Hair Transplantation

Director: E. Antonio Mangubat, MD

Contemporary hair transplantation (HT) technique is a repetitive task procedure. Surgeons worldwide have identified HT as suited for automation because of its repetitive nature. Many techniques and devices have been developed to assist the HT surgeon in speeding up the procedure through various automation techniques and devices. The purpose of this workshop is to present all automation techniques available and allow the participants to evaluate the potential usefulness of each technique in their practices.

201: The Art of Hairline Design

The hairline, more than any other aspect, defines the result of hair restoration surgery. It is often the signature of the physician and becomes that of the patient. Experience, artistic foresight, and knowledge of anatomical landmarks are necessary to produce natural appearing hairlines in all patients. This workshop features experienced physicians who will explore all aspects of artistic hairline creation including: creation of temporal lines/points and the lateral hump, creation of the anterior line (transition zone), the correct exit angle, hairlines in women and ethnic groups, and natural posterior (vertex) hairlines.

202: Estimating the Donor Area

Director: Dow B. Stough, MD

Faculty: Robert M. Bernstein, MD; Steven Chang, MD; John P. Cole, MD

Estimating the requirements for the donor strip length and width has always been a concern for transplant surgeons. This workshop will explore new methodologies, which are being developed for this area. The basic science aspects of follicular unit calculation will be reviewed along with instrumentation which assists in the follicular unit count for our patients.

301: Critiquing Hair Transplant Results


