Continuing Medical Education Mission Statement

CME Purpose The purpose of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery's (ISHRS) CME program is to meet the educational needs of its members and close the gap that exists between current and best practices by providing practice-oriented, scientifically-based educational activities that will maintain and advance skills and knowledge as well as promote lifelong learning for its members. CME activities will result in improvement of physician competence and performance in practice.

Content Areas The curriculum of the ISHRS's CME program includes but is not limited to hair transplantation, alopecia reduction surgery, hair biology and physiology, congenital and acquired alopecias, other hair and scalp related ancillary procedures and disorders, and risk and practice management. (ISHRS Core Curriculum of Hair Restoration Surgery and Core Competencies of Hair Restoration Surgery). Content is determined by the integration of various sources of needs, including gaps in knowledge and/or performance of hair restoration surgeons, national guidelines, emerging research, and expert opinion.

Target Audiences The target audiences of the ISHRS are as follows:

- The primary target audience is its physician members with varying medical specialty backgrounds from around the world.
- Secondary audiences for the CME program include non-member physicians, as well as residents, nurses, surgical assistants and other allied health personnel.

The ISHRS recognizes the importance of and encourages international and interdisciplinary exchange of medical knowledge and practice through calls for papers, and invitations to interdisciplinary and international speakers with special expertise.

Types of Activities The activities that support the CME mission are diverse and multifaceted, in order to provide multiple approaches for knowledge acquisition. CME offerings include the following:

- Annual Meeting, which may include didactic and hands-on courses, live surgery workshops, seminars, scientific sessions, and poster presentations.
- Other activities include regional live surgery and didactic workshops, enduring materials, and Internet CME.

All CME activities will be cost-effective and will meet the criteria for continuing medical education of the ACCME and the AMA Physician's Recognition Award.

Expected Results The CME program will result in improved performance in practice (such as surgical skills) and competence (medical knowledge and ability) among its participants. All participants will be expected to provide written feedback following all educational activities, and the CME Committee will rely on this feedback as well as other methods to assess the effectiveness of educational efforts and direct changes in its CME Program.

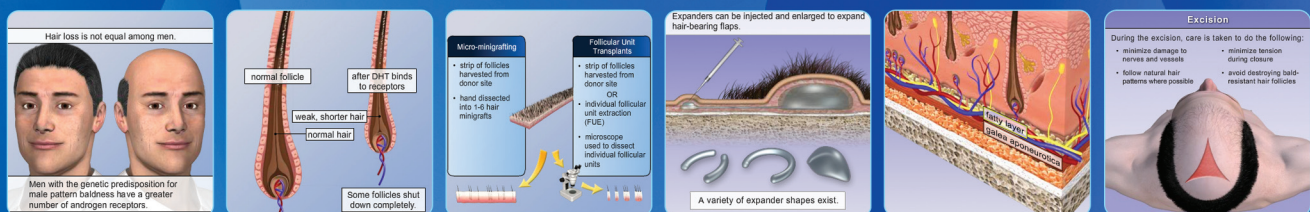

Video, Photography & Audio Recording Policy Video recording and/or photography are prohibited in all educational sessions. Under no circumstances are video, digital or still cameras to be utilized in the educational sessions. Violators will have their cameras/equipment confiscated until the end of the meeting on Sunday. Audio recording for personal use only is permitted (i.e., for gathering information and NOT for rebroadcast or reproduction). Photography of scientific material is prohibited. The only exception to the photography policy are photos taken by the official ISHRS photographers for purposes of use in ISHRS publications.

Cellular Phone/Pager Policy The use of cellular phones and pagers in the General Session, Workshop and Course rooms is prohibited. Attendees must either turn off or vibrate cellular phones and pagers.

Cancellation/Refund Policy Registration fees, less a \$50.00 administration fee, will be refunded upon written notice of cancellation to the ISHRS office received on or before June 19, 2009. After June 19, 2009, there will be no refund of fees for cancellation or for lack of attendance without notification. It is your responsibility to ensure that your cancellation request has been received by the ISHRS headquarters office. "No shows" who have not pre-paid will be invoiced for the total registration fee.

Those who have registered and are unable to attend due to difficulties in obtaining a visa must notify the Society HQ prior to the start of the meeting. No refunds will be issued for lack of notification prior to the start of the meeting.

Speaker Disclosures of Conflicts of Interest All presenters are required to verbally disclose at the podium (or indicate on poster presentations) as well as complete a form disclosing relevant grants or other financial support; consultancies; organizational affiliations; family; departmental or personal financial involvement; patent rights; and other relevant conflicts of interest pertaining to their topic. Such disclosures are also published in the Abstract Book provided onsite at the meeting. The ISHRS follows its approved Policy on Collection and Resolution of Conflicts of Interest (COI) for all presenters and planners.

Obtaining CME Credits & Certificates Physicians will receive in their registration packets a form called "CME Credit Claim Form." Physicians should indicate the number of CME hours they are claiming on this form and turn-in the white copy (top copy) to a collection box located near the Registration Desk. Keep the pink copy (bottom copy) for your files. Appropriate credit for attendance should be ascertained and reported by individual physicians to the particular state or medical society to which he/she belongs.

AAD Members – For those that subscribe to the American Academy of Dermatology (AAD) Transcript Program, you must submit an attendance validation "Green Card". We will mail your green card to the AAD after the meeting. If you did not bring a Green Card with to this meeting, you may mail it directly to the AAD when you return.

Physicians will receive a personalized Certificate of Attendance for CME **mailed after the meeting.** Physicians will only receive a CME certificate if the CME Credits Claimed Form is completed. Ancillary staff will receive a Certificate of Attendance mailed after the meeting.

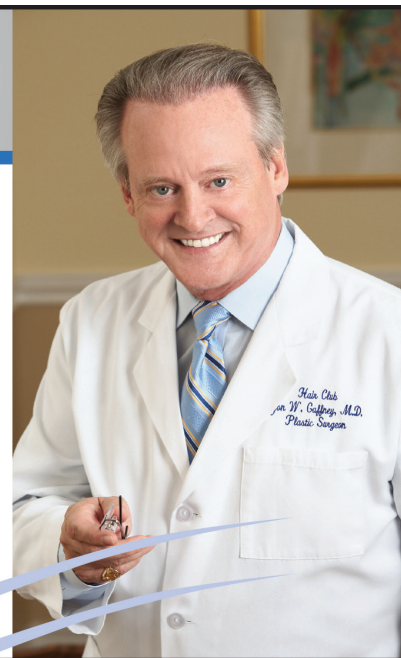

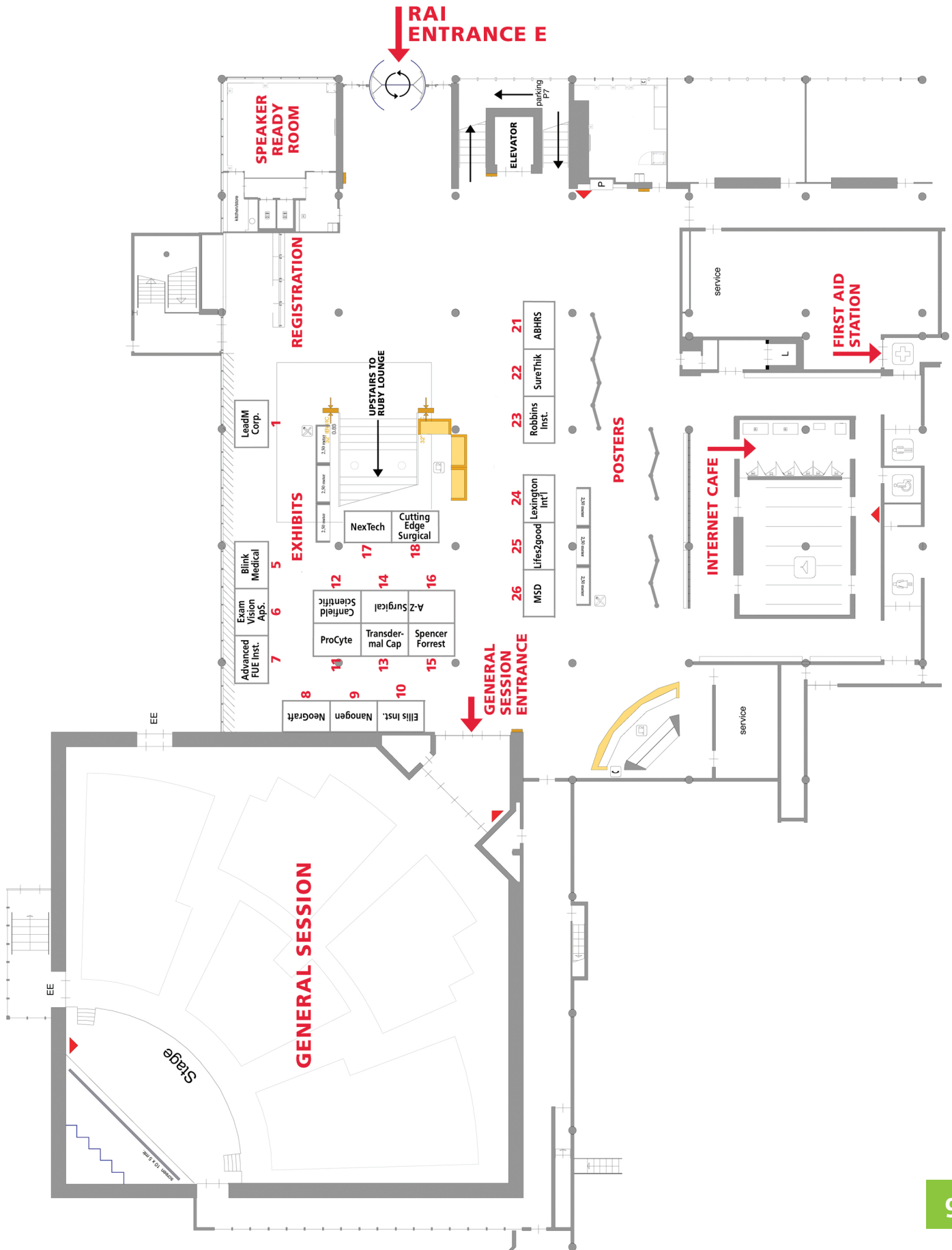

Michael Hamblin is a Principal Investigator at the Wellman Center for Photomedicine at Massachusetts General Hospital and an Associate Professor of Dermatology at Harvard Medical School. He was trained as a synthetic organic chemist and received his PhD from Trent University in England. His research interests are now broadly in the area of phototherapy for multiple diseases. One focus is the

study of new photosensitizers for infections, cancer, and heart disease. A second focus is low-level light therapy (LLLT) for wound healing, arthritis, traumatic brain injury and hair regrowth.

Dr Hamblin has published over 95 peer-reviewed articles, over 100 conference proceedings, book chapters and international abstracts and holds 8 patents. He has edited the most recent and comprehensive textbook on PDT entitled "Advances in Photodynamic Therapy: Basic, Translational and Clinical." He has developed an interest in elucidating the basic molecular and cellular mechanisms of LLLT, and for the past four years has chaired an annual conference at SPIE entitled "Mechanisms for low level light therapy."

Dr. Hamblin will speak on **"The Mechanism of Action of Low Level Light Therapy."**

The Norwood Lecture was established by the ISHRS Board of Governors to honor the immense contributions of O'Tar T. Norwood, MD, co-founder of the ISHRS and founder of the Hair Transplant Forum International.



Dominique Van Neste, MD, PhD

Dominique Van Neste is in private practice at the Brussels' Hair Clinic. He graduated in Dermatology and gained clinical experience in several University Hospitals in Belgium and France. His interest and expertise in the field of human hair growth disorders has been recognized internationally and his research was conducted at Skinterface, a private research facility established in Belgium since 1987. The list of textbooks, chapters and scientific papers can be found on www.skinterface.be.

More than 20 years were devoted to the study of technological and methodological aspects of in vivo measurement of hair follicle activity. Accordingly a non invasive and non destructive procedure applicable in vivo in human subjects is now available. It precisely quantifies all the dynamic aspects of hair replacement including, but not limited to, transition phases of the hair cycle, i.e. growth, regression, resting and shedding in correlation with hair thickness. After an ad hoc external audit, the method was encompassed under the quality label H.A.I.R. Technology™ as contrast enhanced phototrichogram with exogen collection (CE-PTG-EC).

Clinically relevant data are currently collected at the Brussels' Hair Clinic and new information becomes available regarding the dynamics of male pattern hair loss, the pharmacodynamic responses to drugs as it affects specific functional characteristics of the hair follicle before it enters irreversible regression.

Dr. Van Neste will speak on **"Dynamic Aspects of Scalp Hair Growth and Replacement in Male Pattern Hair Loss."**

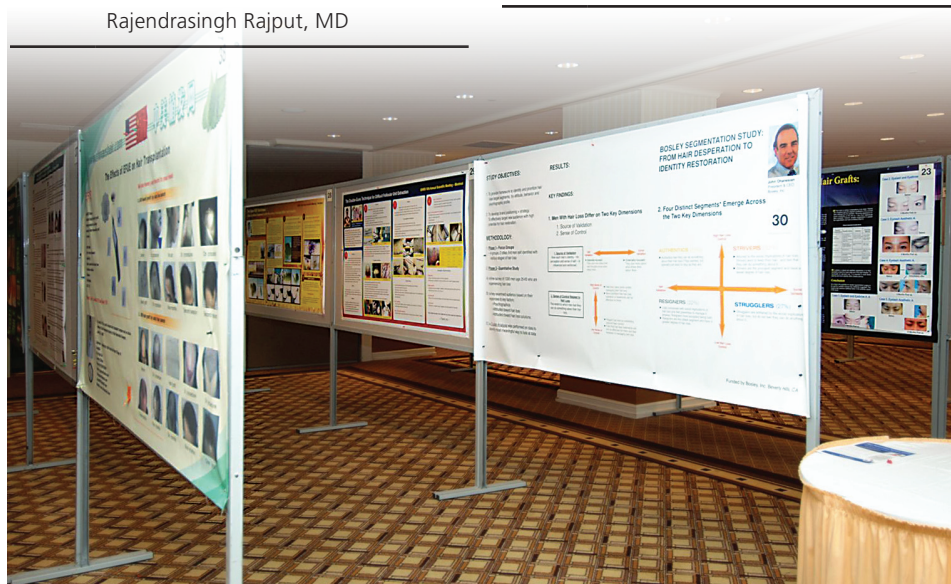

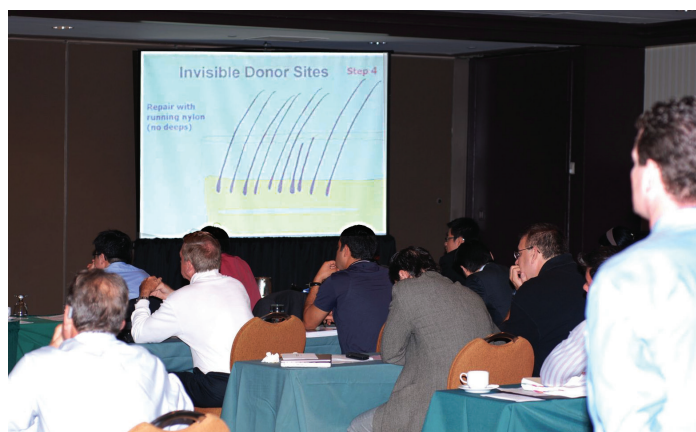

The RAI Convention Centre is Amsterdam's cutting edge convention centre located in the south central area of Amsterdam, easily accessible from the city centre. The ISHRS 17th Annual Scientific Meeting will be held in the neatly contained Forum Congress Centre at RAI. Use Entrance E at the RAI, which is the Forum Congress Centre.

There will not be a provided shuttle service to/from the hotels and the RAI Convention Center. Daily transportation to/from the convention center is the responsibility of each attendee.

HOW TO GET TO THE RAI CONVENTION CENTRE

TRAM: As the streets of Amsterdam can only accommodate limited motor traffic, one of the best ways to travel while there is by tram. The trams run frequently (arriving every 10 minutes or less) and are clean and safe. It is quite easy to get around Amsterdam, and you will see that the locals generally use the trams and bicycles.

Both the NH Grand Krasnapolsky and Park Plaza Victoria Hotels are on **tram line #4** that takes you directly to the RAI Convention Centre stop called **RAI Europaplein**. Note that the conductor may just call out "Amsterdam RAI" for the RAI Europaplein stop. Please be sure you get off here because the next stop that is called "Amsterdam RAI" is much farther away from our entrance. A 60-minute ticket costs €1.60 and is available from the driver in the front of the tram or the conductor in the middle of the tram. If you plan to use the tram very often, a stripcard ("strippenkaart") would be a much better deal and more convenient. This can be purchased at the tobacco shops or train station at the cost of €6.50 for 15 strips. Please ask the front desk at your hotel for the closest store to purchase a strip card. The strip card requires validation at the time of boarding either from the yellow machine in the tram or from the conductor. There are also day, multiple day and weekly passes available. Additional, detailed information about how to use the tram and stripcards is located in the ISHRS's

There is a free map of all tram and bus routes in Amsterdam available from tourist offices or the GVB office in front of Central Station. You may also view this map and more information by visiting GVB Transport - www.gvb.nl. Refer to the diagram below.

TAXICABS: Taxicabs are also an option, especially from the Hilton as there is no tram line there.

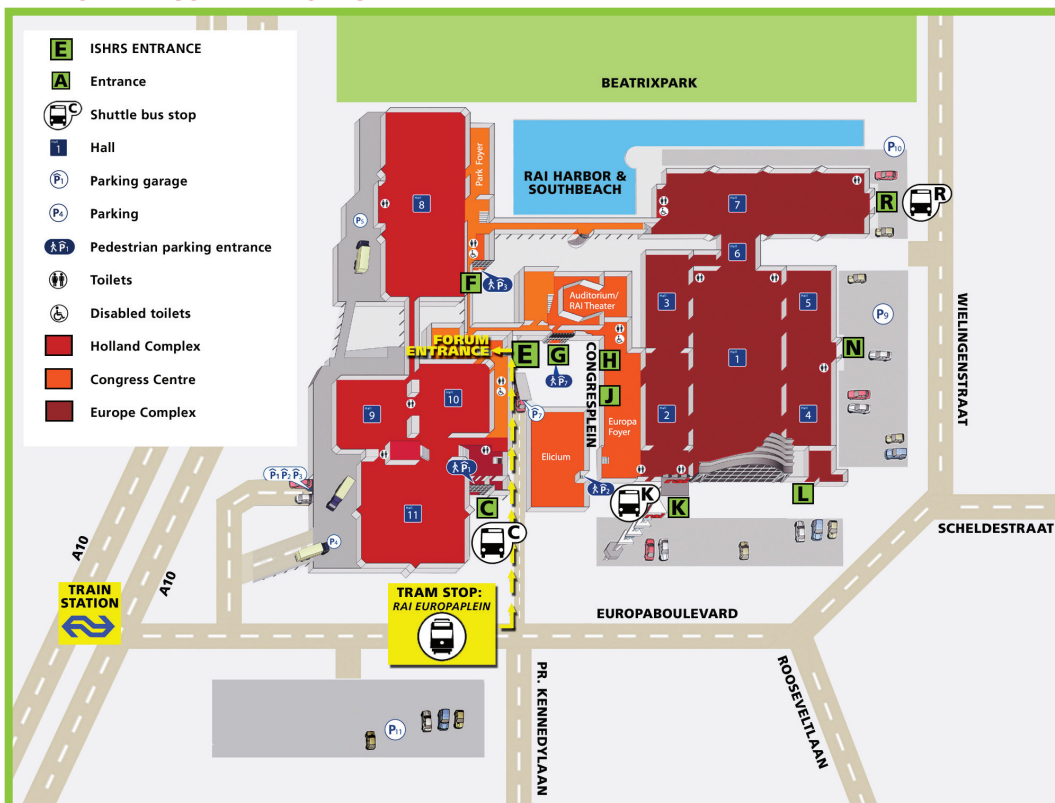
Have your taxi driver drop you off at the door called **Entrance E** at RAI, which is the Forum Congress Centre.

WALKING: If you wish to stay as close as possible to the RAI Convention Center (so you can walk), there is a nearby convention hotel called Novotel Amsterdam City. The Novotel Amsterdam City is a modern, international 4-star hotel. We do not have a group rate at this hotel, but RHTS can help you book a room here if you wish. The Novotel Amsterdam City is not in the city center.

To locate the parking lot, drivers should follow signs for "P Congres" after they have left the highway. THE PARK PLAZA VICTORIA HOTEL

ADDRESS: Damrak 1 - 5, Amsterdam

Built in 1890, the 4-star deluxe Park Plaza Victoria Hotel features 306 contemporary as well as monumental rooms. This hotel is conveniently located in the Amsterdam city centre and is opposite the Central Station. It is within walking distance of shopping and Amsterdam's nightlife. It is also nearby the Dam Square, several museums and the Royal Palace.

GETTING TO RAI: The RAI Convention Centre is a 25-minute ride from this hotel via tram line #4. Get off the tram at the "RAI Europaplein" stop.



NH GRAND HOTEL KRASNAPOLSKY

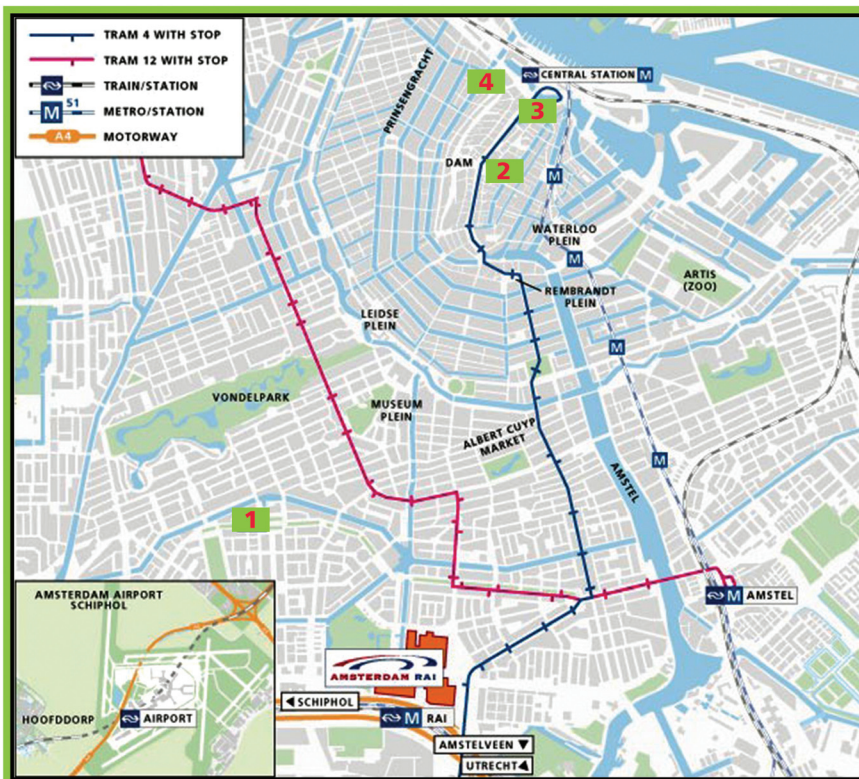

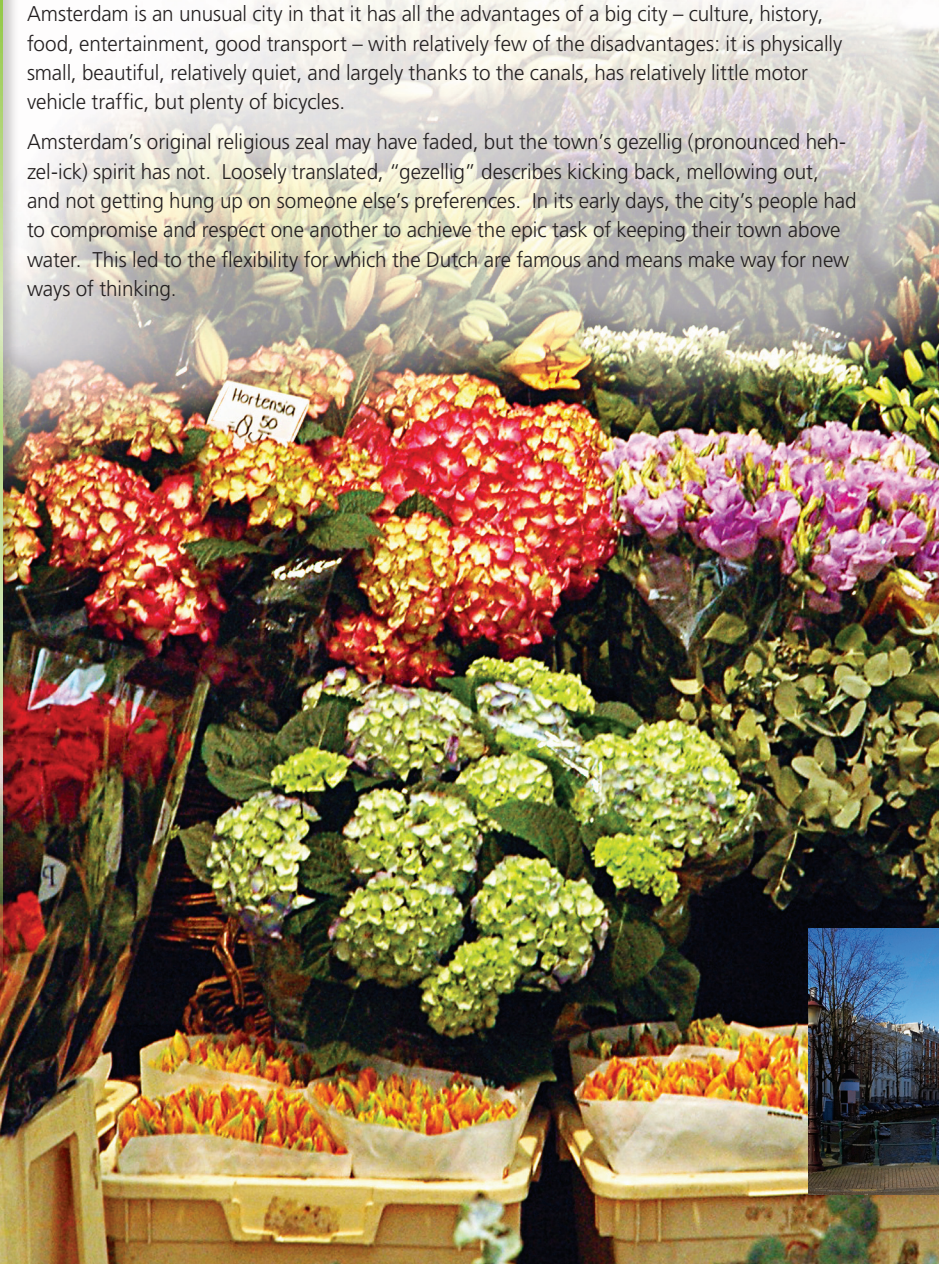

Known for creativity, tolerance and innovation, from the Golden Age to the modern global economy, Amsterdam is a city built on a proud history of commerce. Today's Amsterdam is business-minded and accessible with a rich and perfectly-preserved cultural heritage to show for its success over the years. Clean and quiet, its gabled town houses, peaceful canals, elegant bridges and cobbled streets are a world away from the stress of other major European cities.

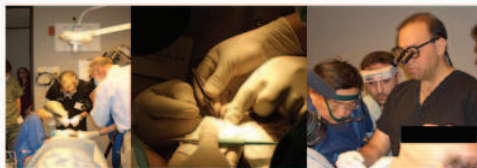

RULES AND PROPER ETIQUETTE

The Annual Scientific Meeting is an educational activity. Attendees are expected to maintain professional etiquette and extend proper courtesies. Inappropriate behaviors will not be condoned. The meeting should not be used as an opportunity for solicitation of other physicians' staff or other unethical, inappropriate, and distasteful activities. It may seem obvious, but it is inappropriate and rude to make negative or soliciting comments to the live patients in the various sessions. Negative or disparaging comments about a patient's results to the patient are offensive, psychologically hurtful, and violate our ethical commitment to "do no harm." Patients who agree to show their postoperative results, as well as the doctors who bring them, deserve our respect and support for their willingness to subject their results to scrutiny and contribute to our learning experience.

Soliciting business in the meeting rooms or meeting area hallways is prohibited. Only registered exhibitors, in the Exhibit Hall, may solicit business. There will be no distribution of handouts, flyers or promotional items other than the official Abstract Book and workshop/course handouts, or other than exhibitor items in the exhibit hall. Any handout or flyer intended for the handout table by the registration desk must be pre-approved by the ISHRS Executive Director. Any unapproved handouts will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings on the message boards will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings on the message boards will be removed and discarded.

It is vital for the doctors to discuss their complications and show patient photos. Public disclosure of a specific doctor's complications or patients is prohibited. There are ongoing debates in any field of evolving science, and disagreement between professionals is expected. However, inflammatory or inappropriate criticism of any specific ISHRS doctor's or assistant's lecture that has been made in good faith and according to the ethical standards of our Society is prohibited.

The timing of any private social functions must be approved by the ISHRS.

The purpose of these guidelines is not to suppress free speech or to conceal items from the public; rather, it is to encourage a free exchange among doctors without worries that anything said or done will be used against them by a competitor. All doctors have complications at various times, but it takes a special form of integrity to discuss them before a large group of colleagues. By the same token, we understand that most of the non-medical promotional professionals in our field provide a helpful public service while pursuing their business interests. We hope this communication between us will be on a high professional level that will benefit both the field and the patients.
