

MESSAGE FROM THE PROGRAM CHAIR

Dear Colleagues,

It is a great honor to serve this year as the Chairman of the scientific program of the meeting in Paradise Island in the Bahamas.

As a brief introduction of what you can expect from the scientific program this year, I would like to say that I have tried to set up a number of sessions with the goal not only of providing scientific information but moreover of stimulating discussion and debate.



A high percentage of the abstracts received this year deal with follicular unit extraction (FUE), which clearly seems again to be one of the topics preferred by the audience. We have set up a "Controversies and Hot Topics Session" which includes an in-depth discussion of important aspects of FUE such as donor area safety, growth survival and robotic FUE. In addition, we are arranging an ambitious hands-on FUE course for those who want to improve their manual dexterity at graft extraction under the guidance of a team of FUE experts.

Surgical video presentations are paramount in this type of meeting. This year we have expanded this section and there will be 17 video presentations, a number of which form part of a "How I Do It" session aimed at comparing different surgeons' approaches to various aspects of the hair transplant procedure.

The poster section this year will receive special attention. Posters are just another way of presenting a scientific study, and should not be regarded as inferior in quality to oral presentations. To give posters more relevance, we have prepared a general session with an open microphone format, in which the posters will be presented one by one and questions can be asked to their presenters.

As in previous years, we have kept the popular Breakfast Workshops, choosing attractive hot topics such as scalp micropigmentation or eyebrow hair transplantation. New this year are two "business" lunch symposiums, "Practice Management" and "Marketing Symposium", which will address important issues to help to build and improve a successful surgical practice.

We cannot forget that science is the motor of innovation and creativity that lies behind our specialty. In this context, I am proud to be able to confirm the presence of two of the most prestigious hair biology researchers, professors Ralf Paus and Bruce Morgan. We have set up a session moderated by Ralf Paus which will address different strategies to induce hair growth, including an update in cell based therapy, scalp injection of growth factors or the role of PGD2 in androgenetic alopecia. Bruce Morgan will decipher the amazing role of stem cells in hair follicle regeneration. In addition, we will devote a whole symposium to finasteride, during which there will be a critical analysis among other issues of the current controversies concerning its sexual side effects.

Scientific aspects aside, our meetings are particularly noteworthy for their spirit of camaraderie and friendship. This year the atmosphere will be even further enhanced by the relaxing environment and natural beauty of the Bahamas Islands. This is a perfect opportunity to bring your kids and enjoy the incredible facilities that the Atlantis hotel has to offer. We look forward to welcoming you to the Bahamas, the perfect setting for the celebration of the 20th anniversary of the ISHRS meetings.

CME Mission Statement

CME PURPOSE

The purpose of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery's (ISHRS) Continuing Medical Education (CME) program is to meet the educational needs of its members and close the gap that exists between current and best practices by providing practice-oriented, scientifically-based educational activities that will maintain and advance skills and knowledge as well as promote lifelong learning for its members. CME activities will result in improvement of physician competence and performance in practice.

CONTENT AREAS

The curriculum of the ISHRS's CME program includes but is not limited to hair transplantation, alopecia reduction surgery, hair biology and physiology, congenital and acquired alopecias, other hair and scalp related ancillary procedures and disorders, and risk and practice management. (ISHRS Core Curriculum of Hair Restoration Surgery and Core Competencies of Hair Restoration Surgery). Content is determined by the integration of various sources of needs, including gaps in knowledge and/or performance of hair restoration surgeons, national guidelines, emerging research, and expert opinion.

TARGET AUDIENCES

The target audiences of the ISHRS are as follows:

- The primary target audience is its physician members with varying medical specialty backgrounds from around the world.
- Secondary audiences for the CME program include non-member physicians, as well as residents, nurses, surgical assistants, and other allied health personnel.



ADVANCES IN HAIR BIOLOGY LECTURER

The Advances in Hair Biology Lecture is generously supported by a grant from Bosley.



Bruce A. Morgan, PhD Associate Professor, Department of Dermatology, Harvard Medical School; Cutaneous Biology Research Center, Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston, Massachusetts, USA.

Dr. Morgan received his PhD in Cell and Developmental Biology from Harvard University in 1987. After post-doctoral training in the Department of

Genetics at Harvard Medical School he joined the faculty of the Department of Dermatology at Harvard Medical School and established his laboratory at the Cutaneous Biology Research Center at Massachussetts General Hospital. His laboratory has focused on the development and regeneration of cutaneous appendages in several model organisms, identifying conserved mechanisms guiding the evolution and morphogenesis of the adnexa of the skin.

Recent work in the Morgan lab has focused on the role of the dermal papilla (DP) in guiding hair morphogenesis and follicular regeneration. Mouse models that allow the manipulation of gene expression specifically in the DP after the follicle has formed have been exploited to probe the role of signals from follicular keratinocytes and other sources that impinge on the DP, and the signals that are in turn generated by the DP to regulate keratinocyte behavior. This work with model systems is integrated in a collaborative effort to analyze the changes in cutaneous appendage biology that distinguish humans from their primate forbears and the genetic variation driving the diversity in cutaneous appendage form and function within different human populations.

Dr. Morgan will speak on, "From Stem to Hair: Deciphering and exploiting the instruction set that guides follicle regeneration."

The Norwood Lecture was established in 2006 by the ISHRS Board of Governors to honor the immense contributions of O'Tar T. Norwood, MD, co-founder of the ISHRS and founder of the Hair Transplant Forum International.

Ralf Paus, MD

Professor of Dermatology and Experimental Dermatology; Head, Experimental Dermatology, Dept. of Dermatology, University Hospital Schleswig-Holstein, Campus Luebeck, University of Luebeck, Germany, and Professor of Cutaneous Medicine, Institute of Inflammation and Repair, University of Manchester, Manchester, UK.



Ralf Paus received his medical degree from the Berlin Free University and served as a Postdoctoral Research Fellow in the Department of Dermatology at Yale University. He is currently Professor of Dermatology and Head of Experimental Dermatology at the University of Luebeck, Germany, and Professor of Cutaneous Medicine at the University of Manchester. Dr. Paus has served as Consultant Dermatologist and faculty member of the Charité Dermatology Dept., Berlin, as Professor and Vice Chairman of the Department of Dermatology at the University of Hamburg, and as Associate and Section Editor of the Journal of Investigative Dermatology. Currently, he is Editor of Experimental Dermatology. He is a prolific writer, having authored over 400 peer-reviewed publications and is a world-renowned researcher in the fields of hair biology (current emphasis: hair follicle stem cells and hair follicle immunology), and neuroendocrinology of the skin.

Dr. Stephen Freedland is a Urologist within the Duke

Prostate Center at Duke University. He is an Associate Professor of Surgery (Urology) and Pathology. He also holds an appointment at the Durham VA Hospital. He is the Vice Chief of Research in the Division of Urological Surgery and the Director of Clinical Research for the Genitourinary Cancer Program within the Duke Cancer Institute. He specializes in the diagnosis, treatment, and long-term management of prostate cancer patients. He has extensive research interests in risk stratification, the role of obesity and nutrition in prostate cancer, and the role of and side effects from hormonal therapy. He completed his undergraduate at UCLA and then medical school at UC Davis. Following this, he completed his residency in Urology at UCLA and a urological oncology fellowship at Johns Hopkins. He currently runs an active research program with funding from the National Cancer Institute, the Department of Defense, and the Prostate Cancer Foundation.

The 2012 Basics Course will take a somewhat different direction from previous years by not including a hands-on station rotation. Rather, it will adhere entirely to a lecture and panel discussion format that stresses the fundamentals while allowing a generous amount of time for questions from course participants. The course is intended to serve as an introduction to the core essentials of the

specialty. The course organizers felt the discussion format would better meet the goals this year.

The course is aimed towards the beginner, including those who have little or no experience performing hair transplants. However, those with all levels of experience are welcome to participate – whether we're novices or seasoned pros, the basic principles guide us through every transplant we do...or don't do.

The course should not be considered a substitute for completing a fellowship in hair restoration surgery or apprenticing oneself to an experienced surgeon for a period of time.

Since the course will be followed by a separate session on FUE harvesting, we will focus exclusively on strip harvesting in the Follicular Unit Transplant.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this course, you will be able to:

- List the elements of the initial consultation and begin to determine how to select appropriate candidates for hair transplantation. Apply the principles of establishing realistic expectations; define supply vs. demand, and the judicious use of the donor area; differentiate between androgenetic and non-androgenetic alopecia; and recognize non-transplantable alopecias.
- Name the medications used for safe and effective administration of oral, intramuscular and intravenous sedation; and explain the safe and effective administration of local anesthesia and tumescence.
- Define the basic principles of donor harvesting: identify the true (safe) donor area; estimate density and calculate the size of the donor strip needed; discuss proper placement of the incision, minimizing the scar, and planning for the future.
- Discuss graft preparation and survival.
- Recognize how to create a natural and cosmetically pleasing hair transplant by understanding the principles of hairline placement and design, and how to achieve cosmetic density.
- Discuss challenging patients and situations for the beginner, including the very young, the very bald, the crown, women, and the psychologically/emotionally unstable patient.
- Define ethics in hair restoration surgery and the principle of "primum non nocere," or providing sound advice and doing what is best for the patient; discuss the elements of informed consent.

Hair transplant surgical techniques continue to evolve becoming less invasive but more technically demanding. FUE, which has evolved over the last ten years, is now mainstream. Patients are demanding it. Improved instruments and experience harvesting FUE grafts have led to decreased transection rates, more follicles per graft, and improved results. Experience is necessary to master FUE with low transection rates.

During this four hour hands-on workshop, after a one hour discussion, FUE punches on manual handles and motorized devices will be available for 50 participants. Beginners as well as experienced physicians will be able use a variety of instruments to refine their skills. Experienced faculty who are FUE experts will be available to instruct and assist participants in the proper extraction of FUE grafts from human scalp cadaver tissue. Microscopes will be available to closely examine extracted grafts. This is a chance to experience the feel of many different instruments, manual and motorized, currently used for FUE with instruction from the experts.

Advanced/Board Review Course Chair: Robert H. True, MD, MPH

The Advanced/Board Review Course will provide an opportunity for hair restoration surgeons to review a range of topics that are representative of information that will be present on both the initial certification exam and the re-certification exam for the American Board of Hair Restoration Surgery (ABHRS). This course will also teach a

methodology for preparing for and navigating the ABHRS written and oral examination. The presentations are intended to provide in depth or advanced information in topics such as the etiologies of hair loss, anatomy/histology of scalp and hair, medical treatments, donor and recipient area management, cell and gene therapy, anesthesia, and emergency interventions.

This course will also have the attendees run through numerous case scenarios to help the attendees hone their skills in preparing to take the oral exam part of the ABHRS Certification Exam. There will be ample opportunities for attendee participation and question and answer sessions.

Course tuition includes online access to the ISHRS Basics Lecture Series enduring material that includes 15 pre-recorded comprehensive lectures covering medical and surgical hair restoration. The material extensively reviews the vital information necessary to pass the ABHRS exam.



Not all types of hair loss are treatable with hair transplantation, including active cicatricial alopecia and alopecia areata. Fortunately, it's usually quite straightforward to identify individuals with classic or advanced cases of these conditions. However, patients in the earliest stages of these conditions can be extremely challenging to diagnose, especially if the pattern of hair loss mimics androgenetic alopecia or if there is co-existent androgenetic alopecia present. Unfortunately,

hair transplantation performed in these individuals may yield poor growth or even no growth at all. This session is designed to help hair transplant surgeons identify patients with contraindications to hair transplant surgery.

As the old saying goes...there is more than one way to skin a cat. Well, the same is true for harvesting donor tissue in hair transplantation!

What is old is new again. The original 1959 Orentreich technique for hair transplantation was harvesting 6mm cylinders of donor skin without suturing the surgical sites. This, unfortunately, led to the infamous moniker for transplants, "plugs". Fast forward about 50 years to the "invention" of the Follicular Unit Extraction (FUE) donor harvest method where Imm or smaller cylinders are extracted without donor closure.

During the decade of the 1990's, the large cylinders of donor tissues were then dissected into segments from large to as small as containing single hairs. Soon, the idea of a strip excision of donor tissue was in vogue. Today this technique remains as the most common method and scientifically-vetted technique of donor harvesting.

What we shall undertake during this interactive educational session is to reflect on how each donor harvesting method is described to patients, how a surgeon might decide on which technique to utilize for a given patient, what may be the best option given various patient outcome expectations, and how are we to address patient misconceptions of FUT and FUE.





RULES AND PROPER ETIQUETTE

The Annual Scientific Meeting is an educational activity. Attendees are expected to maintain professional etiquette and extend proper courtesies. Inappropriate behaviors will not be condoned. The meeting should not be used as an opportunity for solicitation of other physicians' staff or other unethical, inappropriate, and distasteful activities. It may seem obvious, but it is inappropriate and rude to make negative or soliciting comments to the live patients in the various sessions. Negative or disparaging comments about a patient's results to the patient are offensive, psychologically hurtful, and violate our ethical commitment to "do no harm." Patients who agree to show their postoperative results, as well as the doctors who bring them, deserve our respect and support for their willingness to subject their results to scrutiny and contribute to our learning experience.

Soliciting business in the meeting rooms or meeting area hallways is prohibited. Only registered exhibitors, in the Exhibit Hall, may solicit business. There will be no distribution of handouts, flyers or promotional items other than the official Abstract Book and workshop/course handouts, or other than exhibitor items in the exhibit hall. Any handout or flyer intended for the handout table by the registration desk must be pre-approved by the ISHRS Executive Director. Any unapproved handouts will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings on the message boards will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings on the message boards will be removed and discarded.

It is vital for the doctors to discuss their complications and show patient photos. Public disclosure of a specific doctor's complications or patients is prohibited. There are ongoing debates in any field of evolving science, and disagreement between professionals is expected. However, inflammatory or inappropriate criticism of any specific ISHRS doctor's or assistant's lecture that has been made in good faith and according to the ethical standards of our Society is prohibited.

The timing of any private social functions must be approved by the ISHRS.

The purpose of these guidelines is not to suppress free speech or to conceal items from the public; rather, it is to encourage a free exchange among doctors without worries that anything said or done will be used against them by a competitor. All doctors have complications at various times, but it takes a special form of integrity to discuss them before a large group of colleagues. By the same token, we understand that most of the non-medical promotional professionals in our field provide a helpful public service while pursuing their business interests. We hope this communication between us will be on a high professional level that will benefit both the field and the patients.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION DEADLINE: SEPTEMBER 10, 2012

Registrations received after this date are not eligible for the Advance Registration Fees. Post-deadline registrations including those received onsite will be assessed a \$75 late fee and will be processed onsite. If you submit your registration after September 10 you are not considered "Advance Registered" and will not be listed in the attendee roster.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION FEES

The general registration fee includes admittance to general scientific sessions, scientific poster displays, exhibits, continental breakfasts, refreshment breaks, Annual General Business Meeting luncheon on Thursday, one lunch symposium on Friday, the Welcome Reception, one program guide and access to the electronic Abstract Book. For Surgical Assistants and Ancillary Staff categories, it also includes admittance to the Surgical Assistants Program Luncheon. Extra courses, tours and ticketed social events, as well as a copy of the printed Abstract Book require additional fees. All fees are denoted in U.S. dollars (USD).

PHYSICIAN – ISHRS MEMBER: \$1,290 For Physician members of the ISHRS.

PHYSICIAN - PENDING ISHRS MEMBER: \$1,390

For physicians who have applied for membership. A complete application with fee must be received at the headquarters office to be eligible for this rate.

PHYSICIAN - NON-MEMBER: \$1,540

For physicians who are not current ISHRS members and have not submitted a complete application for membership must pay the non-member rate. Registration verification is required for all non-members and must accompany the registration form. Acceptable forms of verification for Non-Member Physicians include: a statement on the physician's letterhead, a copy of the physician's medical certificate or license, or, a letter from a current ISHRS physician member attesting to the credentials as a physician.

RESIDENT CATEGORIES

PHYSICIAN RESIDENT OR TRAINING FELLOW – ISHRS MEMBER: \$595

For Resident Members of the ISHRS or for ISHRS Physician Members who are currently enrolled in an ISHRS-approved Fellowship Training Program or other approved fellowship training program in hair restoration surgery or another specialty. Training Fellows must submit a letter of verification from the fellowship training program director along with their registration form.

PHYSICIAN RESIDENT – PENDING ISHRS MEMBER: \$620

For physician residents who have applied for membership. A complete application with fee must be received at the headquarters office to be eligible for this rate.

PHYSICIAN RESIDENT OR TRAINING FELLOW – NON-MEMBER: \$645

For physician residents who are not current members of ISHRS and are currently participating in an approved residency training programs. Or, for non-member physicians who are currently enrolled in an ISHRS-approved Fellowship Training Program or other approved fellowship training program in hair restoration surgery or another specialty. Training Fellows must submit a letter of verification from the fellowship training program director along with their registration form. Non-member residents must submit a letter of verification from the residency program director along with their registration form.

ADJUNCT CATEGORIES

ADJUNCT – ISHRS MEMBER: \$1,290 For Adjunct members of the ISHRS.

ADJUNCT - PENDING ISHRS MEMBER: \$1,390

For individuals who have applied for and meet the qualifications of Adjunct category of membership. A complete application with fee must be received at the headquarters office to be eligible for this rate.

ADJUNCT – NON-MEMBER/TRICHOLOGIST: \$1,540

For individuals who are not current or member-pending ISHRS Adjunct Members, but meet the qualifications for Adjunct Membership (i.e., individuals who hold a doctorate PhD or equivalent in a biomedical-related area and devote the majority of their professional activities to hair research in an academic setting). In addition, this category includes individuals who are trichologists. Registration verification is required for all non-members and must accompany the registration form. Acceptable forms of verification for Non-Member Adjuncts/Trichologists include: a statement on the person's business letterhead attesting to the credentials of the person or with a certificate of membership in his/her trichologic society.
