MESSAGE FROM THE ISHRS PROGRAM CHAIR

What a journey it has been already! From anticipating the renewal of decades-long relationships and enjoying a visit to another exotic beach location in a beautiful hotel, to figuring out what a "platform" is, how to record our presentations, and what background we should use for the virtual meeting. I visited Panama in 1971 when I was in high school and was looking forward to a return visit almost 50 years later. Hopefully, we can all visit Panama in 2022 for our scheduled 30th annual congress, the 2016 and 2020 meetings were both derailed by viruses, Zika and Covid.

Going virtual has necessitated a lot of changes. The Basic Course was offered as a separate course over two weekends in August. An excellent program was presented by Humayun Mohmand and Shady El-Maghraby that was well attended and well received. The same is true for the Advanced/Board Review Course developed by Jerzy Kolansinski and Sam Lam that took place the last weekend of September and first weekend of October. A big thank you to them for their hard work putting the courses together on short notice.


Due to cancellation of the in-person meeting, the traditional sections; Live Patient Viewing, Newcomer's Breakfast, and Morbidity and Mortality Conference were cancelled. The Chairs of those sections (respectively) Marie Schambach, Nilofer Farjo, and Mauro Speranzini and Greg Williams, became the core of the Virtual Subcommittee along with David Josephitis and Dow Stough.

In preparing for the virtual meeting, we found we needed to learn an entirely new language to pivot from an in-person to virtual meeting. Leading the way was our President, Francisco Jimenez and the ISHRS staff led by Victoria Ceh and Melanie Stancampiano who wasted no time recognizing what needed to be done. As a result of travel restrictions due to the Covid virus, a new industry was developing to help societies of all types present their yearly meetings virtually instead of in-person. We all quickly learned what a "virtual platform" is. Requests for proposals went to several companies and we selected on the Scarritt Group which is a global innovative meeting planning and logistics company specializing in clinical meetings. Founded in 1999, Scarritt Group has executed over 8,000 meetings worldwide and delivers meetings that attendees find memorable and unique. You will find the virtual meeting space is modeled after an actual meeting, is interactive, and easy to navigate.

There is no template for organizing a virtual world congress for hair restoration, so we had a lot to learn. "Best practices" guided us through the process. You will see the results of our education. The more than 100 submitted abstracts were distilled and the best were selected for the eight general sessions. It is boring to sit at your home or office watching one, five to ten-minute lecture, after another so "texturizing" is done to make it all more interesting. Be prepared for active chat, questions, polls, panels, games, contests, and other surprises to spruce up the general sessions. Don't be shy about chatting and submitting questions during the lectures for the panels to answer. We will have designated chat moderators selecting the questions to answer and present to the panels. Lectures will be, for the most part, pre-recorded with the authors available, live, after his or her lecture.

Our featured speakers this year are remarkable. Angela Christiano, Maksim Plikus, Alexey Terskikh, and Danielle Ofri are well-known lecturers. Hopefully, you will be familiar with them before the congress. If not, they are profiled elsewhere in this program. In addition, we have a stellar group of researchers who have agreed to participate in our panels including Carlos Clavel, Claire Higgins, Luis Garza, Ander Izeta, Moonkyu Kim, and Daniel Aberdam. Were it not for the virtual platform and its accessibility to literally anyone, we couldn't assemble this unprecedented group of experts.

The congress will occur between Saturday, October 17th and Sunday, October 25th. Access to the platform will open Monday, October 12, and we will have a short "Welcome Drink and Platform Orientation" on Friday, October 16. The eight general sessions take place on Oct 17, 18, 24, and 25, the two weekends, and consist of two 90-minute periods each day. These sessions will contain the formal lecture presentations, featured lecturers, and panels. Additional courses will be held during the week, October 19-23, between those weekends. Sara Wasserbauer has organized nine fabulous Focused Sessions (workshops) that will be presented, three per day, on October 19, 20, and 21. There is no additional charge to attend so you can register for all of them if you like. That would be impossible with an in-person meeting! In the past some abstracts not accepted for general session lectures were selected for posters, but space was limited. Again, with a virtual meeting we can accommodate an unlimited number of virtual presentations so most abstracts not chosen for

lectures were accepted as CSI (Cases, Studies, and Innovations) presentations which will be recorded as either poster, video, or PowerPoint presentation. These will be downloaded and available a week before, during, and on demand for three months after the meeting, as will all content from the meeting. On Thursday, October 22, there will be two one-hour periods in which these CSI presentations will be discussed. Moderators and the authors will be available to discuss and answer questions about their presentations. Friday, October 23, is a free day. Our awards ceremony will occur at the very end on Sunday, October 25, at 11:30 am CDT. All times are listed as CDT or Central Daylight Savings Time (Chicago) in the United States so please convert to find the time in your region.

This Congress is dedicated to the memory of the ISHRS co-founder and founder of *Hair Transplant Forum International*, O'Tar Norwood, who recently passed away at the age of 89. Those who knew him all have fond memories of him and those who did not will learn about him during the meeting.

Thanks to the ISHRS staff, especially Victoria Ceh and Melanie Stancampiano, who were largely responsible for figuring out this new way of creating a meeting. Thanks also to Francisco Jimenez for his leadership in these difficult times and the entire Scientific Committee for offering their time and enthusiasm needed to texturize this event. We know the content is exceptional, the featured speakers are excellent, the virtual platform is state of the art, and all systems are "go" for a unique educational experience. All we need is YOU to experience it and complete the journey. We look forward to seeing, virtually, everyone.

Attendees utilizing simultaneous interpretation will access the meeting audio via phone and will be provided additional instructions upon registration. Attendees wishing to utilize simultaneous interpretation must advance register for this option via the registration process.

RULES AND PROPER ETTIQUETTE

The World Congress is an educational activity. Attendees are expected to maintain professional etiquette and extend proper courtesies. Inappropriate behaviors will not be condoned. The meeting should not be used as an opportunity for solicitation of other physicians' staff or other unethical, inappropriate, and distasteful activities. Soliciting business in the virtual meeting rooms or spaces is prohibited. Only registered exhibitors, in the Exhibit Hall, may solicit business. There will be no distribution of handouts, flyers or promotional items other than the official Abstract Book, or other than exhibitor items in the exhibit hall. Any handout or flyer intended for the handout table by the registration desk must be pre-approved by the ISHRS Executive Director. Any unapproved handouts will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings in Chat, Conversations, Forums, or other meeting spaces will be removed and discarded. Inappropriate postings on the message boards will be removed and discarded.

There are ongoing debates in any field of evolving science, and disagreement between professionals is expected. The timing of any private ancillary meetings of Global Council Societies must be approved by the ISHRS. No other meetings will be a part of the ISHRS Virtual World Congress this year.

FEATURED SPEAKERS

NORWOOD LECTURER



Angela M. Christiano, PhD

Professor, Departments of Dermatology and Genetics & Development; Vice-Chair and Director of Research, Department of Dermatology, Columbia University, New York, NY, USA

The major focus of Dr. Christiano's research is the study of inherited skin and hair disorders in humans and mice, through a classical genetic approach including identification and phenotyping of disease families, genetic linkage, gene discovery and mutation analysis, and functional studies relating these findings to basic questions in epidermal biology.

Her interests include transcriptional regulation of hair cycling and differentiation, the biology of cadherin-mediated cell adhesion junctions known as desmosomes, and the morphogenesis epidermal appendages such as hair and teeth. A long-range goal of her work is to develop genetic and cell-based therapies for skin and hair diseases through understanding disease pathogenesis. She is using epithelial reprogramming as a therapeutic approach for inherited skin diseases.

For the past 20 years, Prof. Angela Christiano's research has focused on understanding the molecular processes that lead to inherited skin and hair disorders in humans. Her research career began with the discovery of genetic mutations associated with epidermolysis bullosa, a skin disease that causes severe blistering. Dr. Christiano's recent work has focused on the investigation of the underlying genetic causes of and identification of potential therapies for alopecia areata, an autoimmune form of hair loss. She has published more than 300 papers in peer-reviewed journals and has trained more than 50 postdoctoral researchers and clinical fellows at Columbia University through the Program in Genetics & Development, the Institute of Human Nutrition, the Integrated Program in Cellular, Molecular and Biomedical Studies in the Graduate School of Arts & Sciences, the Clinical and Translational Science Award Program, the Stem Cell Training Program.

Dr. Christiano has received numerous awards, including the New York City Mayor's Award for Excellence in Science and Technology – Young Investigator's Award, Columbia University's Harold and Golden Lamport Research Award for Excellence in Clinical Sciences, the CERIES Research Award, and the (North) American Hair Research Society's award for Outstanding Paper of the Year, the Montagna Award from the Society for Investigative Dermatology, and the Ebling Award from the European Hair Research Society. Dr. Christiano is a Past President of the Society for Investigative Dermatology, and served as Deputy Editor of the Journal of Investigative Dermatology for ten years. Dr. Christiano is a prolific inventor and serial entrepreneur, having filed numerous patents on her discoveries, and successfully moved technologies from the academic setting into the commercial sector. She has co-founded several companies in the dermatology space, including Skinetics Bioscience (RNAi-based dermatology therapeutics, acquired by Sirna Therapeutics, which was acquired by Merck & Co. in 2007), Vixen Pharmaceuticals (JAK inhibitors for treatment of hair disorders, acquired by Aclaris Therapeutics in 2016), and Rapunzel Bioscience, focused on regenerative therapies and stem cell approaches for skin and hair disorders. She earned her MS and PhD degrees in Microbiology and Molecular Genetics from Rutgers University.

ABOUT THE NORWOOD LECTURESHIP

The Norwood Lectureship pays tribute to O'Tar Norwood, MD, an Oklahoma physician who had a long and successful career in dermatology. At the time of writing his first book on Hair Transplant Surgery in 1973, he was Clinical Assistant Professor of Dermatology at the University of Oklahoma Medical School, USA. Amongst other things he was a Founding Member of American Society for Dermatologic Surgery and with Dr. Dow Stough he was instrumental in gathering like-minded doctors in 1992 to form the ISHRS. O'Tar was a restless thinker who brought together people and ideas to explain the MPHL process. His letters and communications were so numerous that he started a magazine called the Hair Transplant Forum International. It grew very quickly and became so popular that everyone wanted to read it and contribute articles. Soon after, O'Tar donated the magazine to the ISHRS. Its descendant is the ever-popular Forum we read today. O'Tar continued to publish and teach at our conferences for many years. His name is etched in our history. Those who knew O'Tar fondly remember the informal moments after lectures where his wit and joy for life were wonderful to share. He would welcome all with his cheeky warm smile.

Danielle Ofri, MD, PhD

Clinical Professor of Medicine, NYU School of Medicine, New York, NY, USA

Despite modern medicine's infatuation with high-tech gadgetry, the single most powerful tool in the medical armamentarium is the doctorpatient conversation. This deceptively simple tool can achieve the lion's share of diagnosis and a surprising amount of the treatment. However, what patients say and what doctors hear (and vice versa) are often two vastly different things. Dr. Ofri's presentation will examine whether

refocusing the doctor-patient conversation can actually lead to better outcomes.

Danielle Ofri, MD, PhD, is one of the foremost voices in the medical world today, shining an unflinching light on the realities of healthcare and speaking passionately about the doctor-patient relationship. She writes about medicine and the doctor-patient connection for the New York Times, Slate Magazine, and other publications.

Danielle is co-founder and Editor-in-Chief of the Bellevue Literary Review, the first literary journal to arise from a medical setting. Established in 2019, the Stough Lecture honors ISHRS Co-founder Dow Stough, MD, who in the early 1990's recognized that the fractured, chaotic, and often secretive world of hair restoration needed an anchor. The founding of the ISHRS in 1993 brought order to chaos, turned competitors into colleagues, and created an educational organization that has changed the face and improved the outcomes of hair restoration throughout the world. A very well respected dermatologist from Hot Springs, Arkansas, USA, Dr. Stough was one of the earliest proponents of follicular unit transplantation and natural looking hairlines, and his focus on innovation and teaching is evidenced by Dow being the youngest President, Program Chair, Golden Follicle Award winner, and Manfred Lucas Award winner in ISHRS history. He is a true leader and his contagious enthusiasm has inspired and motivated many hair transplant surgeons. His knack for encouraging colleagues - newcomers and old-timers alike - to get involved, share knowledge, and ask questions, is perhaps his greatest legacy.

ADVANCES IN HAIR BIOLOGY GUEST **LECTURER**



Maksim Plikus, PhD

Editor, Experimental Dermatology; Associate Professor, Department of Developmental & Cell Biology University of California Irvine, Irvine, CA, USA

The Plikus Laboratory for Developmental and Regenerative Biology is interested to understand how complex tissues and organs regenerate under normal conditions and in

response to injury or disease. One goal is to understand how thousands of stem cells coordinate their activities with one another. Another goal is to understand the natural limits of stem cell plasticity in response to tissue injury.

Dr. Plikus received his PhD degree in Pathology from the University of Southern California, where he worked with Dr. Cheng-Ming Chuong and carried out studies on the mechanism of hair stem cell regeneration. Later he joined Dr. George Cotsarelis at the University of Pennsylvania to work on the wound regeneration. Dr. Plikus is currently an Assistant Professor in the Department of Developmental and Cell Biology at the University of California, Irvine.

Alexey Terskikh, PhD

Associate Professor of Neuroscience, Developmental Biology and Aging Program, Sanford-Burnham Medical Research Institute, La Jolla, CA, USA

Dr. Terskikh's lab pioneered the approach that enables differentiation of human induced pluripotential stem cells (iPSCs) into folliculogenic dermal papilla cells (DPCs) and three-dimensional biodegradable scaffold.

Alexey Terskikh earned his PhD at the University of Lausanne, Switzerland in 1996, in the laboratory of Prof. J.P. Mach, where he designed a new type of high-avidity recombinant molecule called Peptabody. He received postdoctoral training with Prof. Irving Weissman at Stanford University, where he discovered a common genetic program between hematopoietic and neural stem cells. Dr. Terskikh holds an Assistant Professor position in the Brain and Mind Institute at EPFL in Lausanne, Switzerland (2002-2006) and was recruited to SBP as Adjunct Assistant Professor in 2002 and as a full time Assistant Professor in 2006.


