MESSAGE FROM THE PROGRAM CHAIR

I want, first of all, to thank President Ricardo Mejia for entrusting me as Program Chair for Berlin. I hope that I do not disappoint him or all of you who are attending. My vision this year has been to radically transform the Congress experience but preserve key elements that continue the wonderful legacy of the ISHRS. A fundamental direction that represents the core of this meeting is to eliminate beginner-level information and focus entirely on advanced techniques and knowledge that can have relevance for the beginner to the advanced practitioner. Too many meetings just overview information that only appeals to a beginner, like how to draw a hairline. Those elements have been entirely eliminated from this program in favor of advancing scientific progress, which an annual meeting is called to do. I have had the luxury of choosing from 227 abstract submissions which is double of an average year, and far more than the maximum of 153 in 2013.


In terms of restructuring, you will see I have replaced Focused Sessions with daily Masterclass options. What is the difference? Masterclasses are deeply granular in nature, where a master in the field will go into a subject matter, with two speakers for 30 minutes each for the total of a one-hour class, rather than hearing a series of shorter lectures in the Focused Sessions.

I have also woven into the daily experience short- and long-format videos because I believe surgeons really can understand technique only through a video didactic format, which also breaks up the monotony of hearing just lecture after lecture. Jae Park invented the long-format video in which I was happy to participate in Korea, where there is live debate running concurrent to a broadcasted, long-format, 5-10 minute video. I hope you will enjoy this new format as much as I did in Korea.

I have also completely reconceived the Coffee with the Experts section. In the past, there were tables dedicated to information like "hairline design" and "eyebrow transplant". I have preserved those tables catered to the beginner to intermediate but have added tables hosted by faculty from the masterclasses, panels, and keynote speakers. The hope is that you can spend valuable 1:1 time with them if you could not get your question answered during their session or just want an extended, intimate encounter with these leaders in the field. I have also put in interesting tables like "Body Hair: Yes or No?" which will be a debate between Sanusi Umar (yes) and Jim Harris (no). I have created sections that are dedicated to business topics like how to create a hair product and how to improve your social media presence.

I have also expanded the schedule to a full 3 days. In the past, the program has oftentimes ended after 2.5 days. I want you to get the maximal educational experience while here in Berlin, and I have packed the schedule to the gills.

Finally, I hope you enjoy a lot of cool surprises that I have built into the program that will make your travel here very memorable from cool gifts to take home, fun experiences, to once-in-a-lifetime things that you won't forget. I call them STAR (something they always remember) moments. I want to thank you all again for your trust in me as your program chair. I am always open to constructive feedback that will help guide Dr. Chumak, who will be next year's amazing chair in Rio. Vielen danke und herzlich willkommen in Berlin!

No video recording allowed.

CELLULAR PHONE POLICY

The use of cellular phones in the General Session or workshop rooms is strictly prohibited. Attendees must either turn off or vibrate cellular phones.

WEATHER

October temperatures in Berlin are generally between 44°F and 57°F (7°C and 14°C) with seven days of rain.

MEETING ATTIRE

The attire for the in-person educational sessions is business.

This attire for the gala is to be inspired by a fusion of cirque, cabaret, the Golden Twenties, and Babylon Berlin. Or as has been a tradition of the ISHRS, you may wear a costume reflective of your native country for the Gala.

MEETING INFORMATION

CURRENCY

Credit cards are the preferred form of payment for all transactions at the registration desk. For those who must pay cash, we will only accept Euros (€) as currency in Berlin.

BADGES

An official ISHRS-issued badge for the 33rd World Congress is required to enter the World Congress. Alterations and tampering with badges is prohibited and subject to the No Badge Swapping Policy.

Only those with a physician's badge will be permitted to attend education designated for physicians only.

BADGE REPRINT POLICY

A penalty fee of €25 EUR will be charged for the first reprint of lost or misplaced badges. A second reprint will incur a penalty fee of €85 EUR. Badges will not be printed a third time.

NO BADGE SWAPPING POLICY

You may not swap badges with other persons. Badges are issued to individuals for that individual's use, and only that individual's use. Replacement badges using another name or badge swapping is prohibited. Unauthorized use of Congress badges shall be subject to a \$2,000 USD fine per violation and punitive action by the Board of Governors, up to and including Congress ejection or possible forfeiture of ISHRS membership.

HOTEL PARKING

Parking is available at the InterContinental Berlin Hotel at the hotel's prevailing rates.

The current self-park rate is €36 Per day (24h).

AIRPORT & GROUND TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

The conference venue, the InterContinental Berlin, is located 18 miles/approximately 30 minutes from Berlin Brandenburg Airport (airport code: BER).

TAXI

Taking a taxi in Berlin is safe but a little more expensive than in other cities. Go to the airport official designated taxi stops to avoid fake taxis that charge a higher price.

Passengers arriving at Terminals 1 and 2 use the north and south taxi ranks in front of T1 on Level E0. You can usually assume that taxis are reputable, but it is not wrong to ask how much the journey to your desired destination will cost.

The trip from Berlin Brandenburg Airport (BER) to the InterContinental Berlin will cost approximately €55 day rate/€58 night rate (night rate is 10:00PM-6:00AM and all day Sunday). Surcharges must be paid for large-capacity taxis and bulky luggage. Payment by credit or debit card should now be possible in all taxis. If paying with cash, be sure to have small notes with you as taxi drivers are not obligated to carry large amounts of change.

RIDE SHARE

Uber is available in Berlin.

AIRPORT TRAIN

A train station is located directly below Terminal 1 (stop is called "Flughafen BER"), so you can transfer directly to trains and the S-Bahn. Take the S9 (S-Bahn) train from Berlin Brandenburg Airport to the Zoologischer Garten stop, which is approximately a 5-minute walk from the InterContinental Hotel (the hotel is located directly next to the zoo). The train departs approximately every 20-30 minutes. The ride from the airport to InterContinental Berlin is approximately 40 minutes long and the price is €4.70 for a ticket for tariff zones ABC.

The best way to buy tickets is at one of the many S-Bahn Berlin sales points, at the ticket machines directly in the stations or conveniently via the S-Bahn Berlin app on your smartphone. The ticket machines are conveniently available in 6 languages (German, English, French, Spanish, Turkish, Polish). Tickets must be validated at the devices at the train stop – there are no turnstiles.

TOUR 1 BUS TOUR & LUNCH

Cost: \$125 USD

DESCRIPTION

Begin the tour at the InterContinental Berlin and drive past the historic Kaiser-Wilhelm-Gedächtnis-Kirche and down Kurfürstendamm, once the glamorous heart of West Berlin. Pass through Tiergarten to the Victory Column, then continue to Brandenburg Gate and Unter den Linden, with views of Museum Island and Berlin Cathedral.

See Alexanderplatz and the TV Tower before heading to the East Side Gallery—Berlin's longest surviving Wall section, now a powerful open-air gallery.

Enjoy a one-hour lunch break at Haus Zenner Biergarten, located on the River Spree in scenic Treptower Park.

Return to the InterContinental via Kreuzberg and Oberbaum Bridge, taking in more of Berlin's vibrant, diverse neighborhoods along the way.

Tour includes lunch and begins and ends at the InterContinental Berlin.

TOUR 2 WALKING TOUR

(Meet the guide in the InterContinental lobby at 9:45AM)

Duration: 2-2.5 hours

Cost: \$50 USD

DESCRIPTION

Start at the InterContinental Berlin and head to Breitscheidplatz to see the famous Kaiser-Wilhelm-Gedächtnis-Kirche—its ruined tower and modern extension tell the story of Berlin after WWII.

Continue along Kurfürstendamm, West Berlin's iconic boulevard, once a symbol of the Cold War era and now lined with shops, cafés, and classic city charm.

Visit KaDeWe, Europe's largest department store. Learn a bit about its history, then enjoy a glass of sparkling wine on the top floor with a view over the boulevard.

End the tour at Nollendorfplatz, a key site in Berlin's LGBTQ+ history. Today it's a vibrant area with many food spots. From here, walk back or take a short U-Bahn ride to the hotel.

This is a one-way walking tour which departs from the hotel and requires self-navigation back to the InterContinental Berlin. Lunch is not included in the price of the tour.


General Sessions, Masterclasses, and the Surgical Assistants Program will be recorded in Berlin and made available to attendees. This material can be accessed within the schedule.


ASKING QUESTIONS IN THE SESSIONS







The Stough Lectureship recognizes an individual with vision and a demonstrated passion for education. Established in 2019, the Stough Lecture honors ISHRS Co-founder Dow Stough, MD, who in the early 1990's recognized that the fractured, chaotic, and often secretive world of hair restoration needed

an anchor. The founding of the ISHRS in 1993 brought order to chaos, turned competitors into colleagues, and created an educational organization that has changed the face and improved the outcomes of hair restoration throughout the world. A very well-respected dermatologist from Hot Springs, Arkansas, USA, Dr. Stough was one of the earliest proponents of follicular unit transplantation and natural looking hairlines, and his focus on innovation and teaching is evidenced by Dow being the youngest President, Program Chair, Golden Follicle Award winner, and Manfred Lucas Award winner in ISHRS history. He is a true leader and his contagious enthusiasm has inspired and motivated many hair transplant surgeons. His knack for encouraging colleagues – newcomers and old-timers alike – to get involved, share knowledge, and ask questions, is perhaps his greatest legacy.

ABOUT THE NORWOOD LECTURESHIP

The Norwood Lectureship pays tribute to O'Tar Norwood, MD, an Oklahoma physician who had a long and successful career in dermatology. At the time of writing his first book on Hair Transplant Surgery in 1973, he was Clinical Assistant Professor of Dermatology at the University of Oklahoma Medical School, USA.

Amongst other things he was a Founding Member of the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery and with Dr. Dow Stough he was instrumental in gathering like-minded doctors in 1992 to form the ISHRS. O'Tar was a restless thinker who brought together people and ideas to explain the MPHL process. His letters and communications were so numerous that he started a magazine called the Hair Transplant Forum International. It grew very quickly and became so popular that everyone wanted to read it and contribute articles. Soon after, O'Tar donated the magazine to the ISHRS. Its descendant is the ever-popular Forum we read today. O'Tar continued to publish and teach at our conferences for many years. His name is etched in our history. Those who knew O'Tar fondly remember the informal moments after lectures where his wit and joy for life were wonderful to share. He would welcome all with his cheeky warm smile.



ÁNGELA HERMOSA GELBARD, MD

Dermatologist, Dermatology Department, Hospital Universitario Ramón y Cajal and at Pedro Jaen's Clinic, Madrid, Spain.

Dr. Hermosa-Gelbard graduated with a degree in Medicine from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid and later specialized in Dermatology at the Hospital Ramón y Cajal in Madrid.

During her residency, she developed a strong interest in trichology, which led her to further pursue specialized training. She completed the International Master's in Trichology and Hair Transplantation at the University of Alcalá, where she now serves as a teacher and also coordinates the hair transplant training program.






